Meeting Minutes Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2C

Call to Order:

1. Commissioner John Tinpe called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Quorum

 Commissioner Tinpe, 20C02, and Commissioner Jeffrey Higgins, 2C03, were present. Commissioner Harold Closter, ANC-2C01, was not present, but Commissioner Tinpe noted that a quorum was reached, with two three out of three ANC-2C commissioners in attendance.

Approval of Agenda

 Commissioner Tinpe made a motion to approve the agenda for the October 19, 2015 meeting. Commissioner Higgins seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 2-0.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

1. Commissioner Higgins made a motion to approve the minutes from the ANC-2C monthly meeting held on September 17, 2015. Commissioner Tinpe seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 2-0.

Treasurer's Report and Business Items

- 1. The monthly Treasurer's report and bank statement read by Commissioner Higgins. The ANC-2C bank balance as of September 30, 2015 was \$33,112.71. There were no expenses since the last statement. There was a deposit of \$1,541.59 on September 15, 2015, which was the ANC allotment. The ending balance from PNC bank \$34,654.30. Commissioner Tinpe made a motion to approve the report. Commissioner Higgins seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 2-0.
- 1. Commissioner Higgins read the budget and expenditures from FY2015 and also the proposed budget for FY2016, both of which were previously prepared by Commissioner Closter, the ANC-2C Treasurer. Commissioner Tinpe made a

motion to approve the budget report from 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Higgins and it passed by a vote of 2-0. Commissioner Tinpe made a second motion to approve the 2016 budget. Commissioner Higgins seconded the motion and it also passed by a vote of 2-0.

- 1. Jane Sun (guozsun@yahoo.com / 240-449-9512) requested support for an ABRA, Retailer's Class "C" Restaurant, for wine and beer only, at Pho 88 Bar & Grill, at 608 H Street NW, Washington, DC. Commissioner Tinpe made a motion to support the application. Commissioner Higgins seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 2-0.
- 1. Commissioner Tinpe announced a request for extend hours on a liquor license for Chinatown Garden Inc., at 618 H Street NW (ABRA-025796, Retailer's Class "C" Restaurant, Hank Cho 202-737-8887). The request was to change the hours of operation and alcoholic beverage sales/service/consumption. Sunday to Thursday, hours would be extended to change 2:00 a.m. and Friday and Saturday hours would change to a closing time of 3:00 a.m. Commissioner Tinpe made a motion to support the application. Commissioner Higgins seconded the motion and it passed by a vote of 2-0.
- Commissioner Tinpe announced that a presentation was postponed until November 2015 for Starbucks Coffee #2749, at 433 7th Street NW (ABRA 100585, Retailer's Class "D" Restaurant). Commission Tinpe said the request would be for extended hours and for a permit to sell alcohol. A resident in

attendance expressed concerns about the extension of hours and also noise from drinking outside on the street.
